## **SKIJOR COMPETION RULES**

1. Marshals & or a veterinarian may excuse any competitor, (human or equine), from competition for behaving in an unsafe or unsound manner.

2. A team consists of horse, rider & \*slider (this term encompasses both skiers & snowboarders throughout this document.) Or in the case of a horse being driven, Slider and horse they are being pulled by.

3. Horses may only run a maximum of three times and again in the finals if qualified.

4. Riders & Sliders may separately compete a maximum of THREE times per event.

5. Registration is by team only. Waivers will need to be signed at registration. Registration will take place the afternoon of the competition.

6. All sliders must wear approved snow sport helmets. Eye protection is recommended.

7. Finishing the Race – the Slider must finish in an upright position & on at least one ski, with rope in hand when crossing the finish line. Both slider's boots must cross the finish line.

8. Pylons - Both ski tips & both boots must go around a pylon, or it is considered missed.

9. Field/course. Riders & Sliders will have an opportunity to walk course on foot before competition starts.

10. Order of go will be determined by draw and posted at registration.

11. 2 Divisions: Rider/Horse/Slider and Horse/Slider (driven horse)

12. Fastest time wins.

#### **PENALTIES**

- 1. A five second penalty is assessed for each missed obstacle.
- 2. A five second penalty is assessed for any horse touching any of the obstacles

#### **CIRCUIT COURSE**

1. LENGTH - Approximately 400m, semi-circle track (this is an estimate, we will not know for sure until the track has been constructed.

- 2. PYLONS standard pylons that riders must go around as course map describes.
- 3. JUMPS up to three jumps, not exceeding three feet in height.

### EQUIPMENT

- 1. Horses to be ridden in western saddle with horn.
- 2. Ropes must dallied around saddle horn, no tying of ropes to anything/anyone.
- 3 Ropes must be minimum 30 feet in length & maximum 50 feet in length.
- 4. Handles & loops are NOT permitted.
- 5. All sliders must wear approved snow sport helmets; eye protection is recommended.
